By The Numbers

10 Years – Since the Acute Care for the Elderly Unit officially opened its doors, offering an interdisciplinary team approach to the care of elderly patients.

20 Years – Of heart attack care, providing lifesaving, high-quality, research-based heart care in the communities we serve.

22 First-Year Residents – Welcomed to LHAAMC in internal medicine, obstetrics and gynecology, and surgery. In 2023, we also celebrated the graduation of three surgery residents and 15 internal medicine residency graduates from the Donald and Emily Sheets Graduate Medical Education Program.

30 Minutes – The average length of a blood donation. Each year, over 3,000 Luminis Health patients receive a life-saving blood transfusion. LHAAMC is one of the few hospitals in the country with its own blood and platelet bank.

40th Anniversary – For 40 years, the LHAAMC Foundation has partnered with our community to raise vital funds for our hospital. Since our incorporation in 1983, the community has contributed \$250 million for our hospital's greatest needs.

500 Babies – Cared for in Teddy's Place, LHAAMC's Level III neonatal intensive care unit (NICU), one of only a few in the state of Maryland.

800 Patients - Seen annually in LHAAMC's Advanced Primary Stroke Center

1,657 Patients – Were seen for substance use disorder services at Pathways, LHAAMC's drug and alcohol treatment center, plus 1,025 opioid abuse and overdose cases.

3,650 Patients – Experienced outstanding palliative and hospice care in the Luminis Health Gilchrist Lifecare Institute since its inception in 2022.

4,000+ Items – Including toys, books, games, sensory items, and first aid supplies donated to our Geaton and JoAnn DeCesaris Family Foundation Pediatric Emergency Department and Inpatient Unit to assist our Child Life Specialists. This year, our Pediatric Department has cared for 22,000 patients – our highest volume ever.

5,500 Babies – Born at the Thomas J. Frank Family Birth Center. As the second-busiest birthing hospital in the state of Maryland, LHAAMC's compassionate team cares for nearly a kindergarten classroom born every single day!

\$650,000 – Raised through the 17th annual Fish For A Cure Tournament, Paul C. Dettor Captain's Challenge, and Shore Party to support the Cancer Survivorship Program at LHAAMC's Geaton and JoAnn DeCesaris Cancer Institute.

\$77 Million – Given back in community benefit including low-cost and free screenings, educational programs, and diagnostic services to all members of our community — especially the underserved or those at high risk for illness.

- Luminis Health Anne Arundel Medical Center (LHAAMC) received an "A" Leapfrog Hospital Safety Grade for spring 2023. LHAAMC is the only hospital in Maryland to maintain an "A" rating every quarter since 2018.
- U.S. News and World Report named LHAAMC's Thomas J. Frank Family Birth Center as High Performing in its inaugural edition of the Best Hospitals for Maternity Care. Out of the 2,700 hospitals nationwide that offer maternity services, the publication recognized 237 hospitals.
- For the third consecutive year, LHAAMC is one of 15 hospitals to receive the American Association for Respiratory Care (AARC) Apex Recognition Award for demonstrating continued best practices in respiratory care.
- LHAAMC is ranked among America's 100 Best Hospitals for the Orthopedic Surgery Award and Spine Surgery Award, as well as among America's 50 Best Hospitals for the Surgical Excellence Award.
