LHAAMC uses age-appropriate language and medical materials to help children understand what to expect with their treatment and recovery, resulting in a proven reduction in pain medication across a patient's story. Also, child life specialists use therapeutic play to help children cope with the stress, fear, and confusion that can occur during a hospital experience. These are services typically found at specialized pediatric hospitals, but because of philanthropy, LHAAMC offers them for patients and their families here, close to home.
